Shopping Rules

Please keep in mind these rules when shopping Cinderella's Closet.

- Shoppers must be currently enrolled high school female students.
- Each student must present a valid school ID card or other proof of current enrollment.
- All items will be distributed on a first come, first served basis.
- **CELL PHONES AND CAMERAS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE BOUTIQUE!** While they are allowed in the waiting room, we will confiscate them if used while in the boutique, to be returned upon check out.
- Each student will be allowed to bring **ONE FEMALE** guest with them into the boutique to help them shop with a volunteer. **CHILDREN WILL NOT BE ALLOWED INTO THE BOUTIQUE** as it is not a safe place for them.
- We discourage males from coming to Cinderella's Closet. Males will only be allowed in the waiting area. No males are allowed in the boutique.
- If you bring more than one person to the waiting room with you, we reserve the right to require the extra person(s) to leave.
- Volunteers will serve as personal shoppers for the students attending the boutique.
- Each student will be asked to wait until a volunteer personal shopper becomes available before she can begin shopping. Please plan accordingly (i.e. bring something to read/eat and don't make other appointments for that afternoon.)
- Students should dress appropriately for trying on dresses in a community dressing room. For example, undergarments are required. Students may also wear bathing suits, leotards or slips.
- Students will be allowed to receive one dress plus related accessories and makeup, if available.
